Preparation for the Master of Arts in Rabbinic Studies

Graduate students applying for the Master of Arts in Rabbinic Studies generally have at least an undergraduate background in Jewish studies and in the discipline which they seek to pursue, as well as a working knowledge of Hebrew.

An undergraduate concentration in Jewish studies is not required, though training in the humanities or social sciences (e.g., languages, literature, philosophy, history, sociology or anthropology) is helpful.

The program requires 60 graduate courses plus a practicum of six credits.

Clusters starts in the Spring (May), Fall (August) and Winter (January).

The cost per credit is \$750.00. Scholarships are available. The date line for the 2012-2013 was March 1st, 2012.
